What a summer! We have taken on a greens project, membership drive, another step in tree removal, and dredging the creek on #12. We are nearing the end of all these projects, and I feel they have been super successful thanks to the coordination of the committees and our Chatmoss team. I guess when you are asked to do more you tend to step up your game, and the result of these projects are going to take Chatmoss to another level of being one of the premier clubs in the state.

The greens project has gone on schedule. In a short 8 weeks, the "grow in period" has gone extremely well considering we had to put a majority of the sprigs back on the greens after two gully washers. There are a few areas that need more time but they look fantastic-GREEN! We have needed to dredge the lake on #12 for some time now and finally pulled the trigger on this project. We were in jeopardy of affecting our water supply. We continued the tree removal project to help air flow and remove trees around greens that would shade the new Bermuda grass. We will receive close to \$30,000 from this project. All will go toward the "clean up" and other course improvements. Thanks to Tim Hairfield and his team for helping us coordinate this effort. They are pros and have done an awesome job and dramatically improved the feel of the course. Keep in mind, we are trying to make up for 60 years of neglect. Last, but critical to the future of the club, is the membership marketing effort. At the time of the letter, we are at 35 new members! I feel this is super successful and CGM, Creative Golf Marketing, says we should see a surge in the last few weeks of the program. Thanks to all of you who have used the tools available in the marketing program to get new members. Our members are our best ambassadors to sell the club and it has worked.

Another positive is we haven't seen a drop off in usage at the club while the golf course has been closed. I attribute this to our House Committee organizing a busy schedule of events, and most importantly, the membership has been supportive.

Seeing how this is September/October Newsletter, this will be old news by now, but the day we have been eagerly awaiting has past. We opened the new greens for play on August 17th, and were well received. The main question that everyone has been concerned about was opening too soon and negatively impacting the health of the greens. From a health standpoint they are doing very well. Opening to golfer traffic is nothing compared to what we have done to them lately in terms of cultural practices. Four heavy sand topdressings, dragging the sand with a steel mat and drag mat, aerating, rolling with a 1.5 ton roller 4 times, double and triple cutting, fertilizing heavily to push growth, etc. . Everyone is understandably stuck in terms of thinking about bentgrass and summer stress. Right now the hot, humid weather is what the Champion lives for. It is growing, and holds up to abuse well right now. So really there is no need to worry that you are hurting them by playing.

In terms of quality I would have liked to have had upon opening, they are not quite there yet. The early washouts certainly set us back. As a result we have worked and continue to work on filling in bare and thin areas. To do this requires us to keep the fertility rate high, which forces a lot of growth. This lush growth is not good for producing green speed. Until we get the complete coverage we want greenspeed will not be as good as we will eventually see. We are planning to topdress 1 or 2 more times heavily before we get past early September which will help with smoothing out areas and filling the gaps and getting us covered over.

The ring around the greens is another issue we are working on. It is filling in slowly but surely. Our desire is to maintain a nice clean edge between the collar and putting green surface. Stolons or runners from the collar got out ahead of us sprigging so we were forced to take drastic measures to keep the collar grass from growing out into the putting surface. I would say our timing and technique were poor to say the least and we ended up with a larger band around the greens without any grass. In time this will fill and we will have a nice edge between the putting surface and collars.

Hopefully everyone is getting a chance to enjoy the new greens now and not needing to travel as much to play golf. Keep in mind they are going to keep improving as they fill in and smooth out. Next summer I expect them to really shine.
