

On The Greens

It's said that "time flies when you're having fun", so true for my first year on the job. Where has the time gone? Just over a year ago, I stepped onto the grounds here at Chatmoss for the first time, I blinked, and we were wrapping up our first season. With a new year comes new opportunities and new challenges. Our maintenance plan is to keep carrying on with course improvements to further advance our goal of keeping Chatmoss Country Club the premier private club in the area.

Since the last time we talked, leaves have since fallen and are no longer a major issue, but winter projects have already begun. I hope that everyone has noticed the tree work we've been doing to ensure safety for members and their guest. We have taken down many of the dead ones that have plagued the property the past few years and posed major safety concerns for our patrons. We still have quite a few to go but are steadily chipping away at it. We have plans of working to improve the bunker conditions

by adding sand and improving drainage. We will be completely redoing the right-side bunker on #17 and the left-side trap on #10. We will improve or replace the drainage, apply a bunker liner, and re-sand these traps. We have other drainage jobs, notably the right side of #8 fairway to complete on our way to spring. We have been trying to aesthetically enhance various areas on the course by clearing, pruning, and trimming. I would like to remind everyone that though we have had fairly mild weather conditions so far, we are moving into the typically harsher months of winter and I encourage those that can help, to help, in case of coverings. Keep your fingers crossed that those are sparce in the coming months. It is my hope that we continue to build upon 2021 and make 2022 golf season the best one yet. Thank you for your support. 
